Alex, selfishly intrigued by Chris's response to her ad, offers Chris a job as a production assistant.

Given the cast of characters, this is where the stylish thriller, directed by Canadian Midi Onodera, leaves you with its own indelible mark.

## GenderFuck by Marci Blackman

Three offerings in this year's Lesbian/Gay Film Festival bend, strip, chew, screw, twist break and fuck the confines of gender right up the ass.

Canadian Midi Onodera's feature about the exploitative relationship between Alex, an obsessed filmmaker making a movie about tattoos, and Chris, the FTM production assistant enamored of her, this film does have some thought-provoking moments. Among them is the way Onodera manages to accurately capture the dyke community's consistent discriminatory treatment of the "other," whoever that other may be (in this case, it happens to be someone transgendered). At times, Onodera's film exposes our tendency to dislike and fear people we don't understand, people who are not like us, the same kind of prejudice that drove most of us from our respective cultural communities.

esbian identity is a many-splendored thing, comprising sex, gender and class (among other things). Grouped below under these reductive concepts are some of the dozen-plus full-length films in this year's festival made for, by or about dykes.

**Mind Over Body** 

If men have minds, what's one of them doing in a woman's body? Two wildly different takes on this age-old conundrum are dealt with in a borderline trashy (that's a compliment) tattoo-fetish flick and a stately (compliment 2) historical biopic. Midi Onodera's Skin Deep (June 13) features an FTM soul-in-anguish looking for salvation in the wrong place: the trendy production studio of dragon lady Alex, who may or may not be a backhanded homage to Yoko Ono. Other riveting characters include a Japanese tattoo master and Penny Loafer, the MTF with a heart-of-gold. The pain-is-love mood of the film-set-within-a-film runs on psychological torture and delivers some real violence — all of it motivated and none of it fatal.
